Discussion about plant taxonomy with reference to 'Salix', 'Vicia', 'Viola' and 'Conferva'. W7.073

- 19 May 1835: Does not have list of plants mentioned in the 'Botanical Miscellany' and 'Journal of Botany'. Sends list of plants from Chile and Buenos Aires. Has sent descriptions and names of some to De Candolle. W8.016

- 29 Jun 1835: Schleicher admits to inventing plant species in order to have more to sell. De Candolle sells garden specimens as wild. Emanuel Thomas reliable. 'Peninsular Flora' published. Need to eradicate synonyms. Surprise at Winch's herbarium containing only 1500 indeterminate species. Arnott thinks he has about 20,000 to be checked. Names of European contacts. Asks Winch to collect parcel and buy books. Greville an alcoholic. Description of 2 plant species ['Doronicum']. Opinion of Lindley's 'Nixus'. W8.020

- 29 Oct 1835: Unable to help further with classification of plants from Chile. Hooker's [catalogue?] in 'Companion to the Botanical Magazine'. Problems of classification of foreign flora. Arnott's herbarium very disorganised. Too few specimens from Wight to satisfy all the subscribers to herbarium. Sends corrections to identification of Matthew's specimens. W8.037

- 25 Apr 1836: Cuming's and Matthew's foreign plants not fully classified yet. Advice on arranging the collections. Sends list of names for Cuming's plants. Hooker in process of naming Drummond's plants. Promise of plant specimens. Stoke's method of dipping plants in hot water. No plans to start prodorus. De Candolle been ill. W8.049

- 5 May 1836: Account of the founding of the Botanical Society of Edinburgh. The Society will offer exchange of plant specimens. W8.051
